Notebook 1 - Each of fourteen pages lists a flower (rose?) variety and specifications such as cost, and stem (?) length.

Notebook 2 - Twelve pages list people "we have been entertained by, " their phone numbers and physical descriptions, and if "returned"

Notebook 3 - 1928 - Trip to Mexico (?)

Ten pages of notes on acquaintances in Spain

Thirty-one page diary of April, 1928, describing librarians, libraries and meetings

Eleven pages of Spanish grammar and vocabulary

Fifty-three page letter to "Dear Ladies" Nell, Margery, Mary from: St. Louis 4/11/28

Lampazos to other cities (?), Mexico 4/13+ (flora. houses, bull fight, meetings, dinners, speeches, libraries, churches)

Notebook 4 - 1942 - trip to Mexico

Nineteen page letter to "Nell and Family" - April 12-14, 1942:

The first half describes the flight to Mexico.

Then it tells of a dinner party with the President (of Mexico?) in honor of a dedication of?

The rest concerns a party at the Pan American Library and a luncheon with Pan American Round Table on Pan American Day

Notebook 5 - 19? - Europe (Germany, Holland, France)

Thirteen pages. List of cities with items and odometer readings; menus. Account of expenses (gasoline, dinner, rooms)

Notebook 6 - 1946 - Europe - UNESCO

Sixty-nine pages (first three are missing) of a letter to "Nell & family" Nov. 8 - Dec. 14, 1946:

Describes sea voyage to Halifax and 2 (?) day stopover there.

Includes clipping with picture of him and three others in U.S.

delegation to Paris UNESCO Conference. (Milam and the others are as "members of the State Department.")

Voyage to Europe: deck tennis, movies, meals. Includes "Landing Arrangements" Instructions to passengers. Tea with Canadian delegation at Southhampton

UNESCO meetings and receptions in Paris and Geneva

Return to London; newspaper clipping on the "Fog Black-out"

Brief notes of return voyage on the <u>America</u>. ("about 15 UNESCO people on board.") Includes typed letter to Nell from Helen Hayes.

Notebook 7 - 1929 - Europe (France, Italy, Spain, England)

Sixty-six page letter to "Nell & Margery & Mary":

Describes drives and train trips through France and Italy

Dinners and meetings with the Congress ("I made a few notes as a kind of ass't sec'ry.")

Audience with the Pope

Train, boat trip to Spain (National Library, el Prado)

Trinity College (drawing of the Great Court and adjacent area)

Meetings in England with 400-500 "from all countries"
