I. Diaries and Notebooks

Diary of S.K. Bodman (Monticello, Piatt County, Illinois), 1857. Original and partial transcript.

This handwritten miniature diary begins March 27 and continues through December 31. It makes references to his daily affairs and movements in Illinois and especially comments on his activities as school teacher. The first portion of the diary is devoted to credit-debit figures which appear to indicate that some of his travels or movements were for the purpose of collecting money.

Diary of Joseph Bodman (Williamsburgh, Massachusetts), 1860. Original and transcript.

This handwritten pocket diary covers the period from January 7 through April 28. There are references to business activities and family matters, but the most significant portion relates to a hunting trip to Florida.

Diary of Joseph Bodman, 1866. Original and transcript.

This transcribed diary covers the period from January 4 through September 17. There are also references to farm and other business affairs as well as personal and family matters. Of special interest is a fishing trip to Minnesota (August 21-September 17).

Diary of Joseph Bodman (Illinois), 1868. Original and transcript.

This handwritten diary covers the period from December 30, 1867, through November 17, 1860. The main part is devoted to a hunting and fishing trip to

Florida, December 30, 1867, to April 14, 1868. This section includes interesting comments and descriptions of the Civil War's impact on the country and a few brief comparisons of present costs and prices with those of his pre-war trips. After this trip the entries deal primarily with local business matters and costs. Several entries deal with an epidemic of Spanish Fever among cattle.

Diary of Joseph Bodman (Bement, Illinois), 1869. Original and transcript.

This handwritten diary contains only twenty entries over the period January 12 through December 22, 1869. Included are a reference to Texas Fever among cattle, several addresses and business entries.

Diary of Joseph Bodman (Bement, Illinois), 1870. Original and transcript.

This handwritten diary, containing 28 entries, covers the period February 15 through May 10, 1870. Most of these brief entries relate to a hunting trip to Florida. A few addresses are included.

Diary of Joseph Bodman (Bement, Illinois), 1874.

This handwritten pocket diary contains entries for January, April, May and December. Most of the entries deal with business matters, but there is a memorandum on a mortgage of a John Cole, July 17, 1874.

Diary of Joseph Bodman (Bement, Illinois), 1877.

This handwritten notebook diary contains entries from January 3 through April 5, 1877. Almost all the entries concerns a trip to Florida, January 2 through March 3. There is one other entry, dated April 5, and a few notes.

Notebook of Joseph Bodman (Bement, Illinois). Agreement forming a corporation to prospect and mine for coal. October 6, 1883.

This notebook contains the agreement, signatures, and number of shares per individual. Also there are entries on coal seams "as described by state Geologist" on Danville and Decatur coal and other deposits.
