Box 1

A relative of the donor of the collection created an organization and identification system for the Dakota frontier and Huntsville, Alabama letters. The letters were labeled with a four-character code. The first two characters refer to Robert's location at the time the letters were written: DK for Dakota Frontier or HV for Huntsville, Alabama. The third character is a number that represents the place of the letter in chronological order. The final character is a capital letter which refers to the individual page. For example, HV3C would be the third page [C] of the third letter [3] in the Huntsville [HV] series of letters. This code also connects the letters to handwritten transcript pages and notes provided by the donor. The individual letter code, HV3 for example, may be found with the letters below.
