#### I. Thomas Hancks

This series contains manuscripts and notes of an unpublished work on Thomas Hancks, a man who lived in colonial Virginia. Horner speculated Hancks was an ancestor of Nancy (Hanks) Lincoln. The manuscripts are mostly undated drafts of excerpts from the complete text that vary in length and format. Hancks/Hanks/Hanckes appear as variations of the same surname.
