Edward H. Jenison met Lt. Commander H. B. Miller, the author of *Navy Wings*. Not knowing who he was, Jenison failed to stand up at attention and so feared a court martial.

 November 1, 1944, to Theodore Calvin Pease. Enclosing mimeographed Daily Press, mainly war news.
 November 10, 1944, to Marguerite Jenison Pease. References Edward Steichen. Disappointed by FDR's reelection.
 December 5, 1944, to Marguerite Jenison Pease and Theodore Calvin Pease.
 December 17, 1944, to Ernestine (Jenison), Mother, Marguerite, and Everyone. Written in the Philippines. (Page 2 is missing).
 December 25, 1944, to Mother, Ernestine, Marguerite, and Theodore. Jessie Sumner arranged for Edward H. Jenison to visit Brig. Gen. Bonner Feller, at MacArthur's headquarters. 4 pages.
 January 11, 1945, to Marguerite Jenison Pease and Theodore Calvin Pease.
 February 7, 1945, to Marguerite Jenison Pease and Theodore Calvin Pease. Written while in Brisbane, Australia.
 March 3, 1945, to Theodore Calvin Pease. Interviews Japanese prisoners of war. Recalls seeing FDR at Yalta. 7 pages.
 April 2, 1945, to Marguerite Jenison Pease and Theodore Calvin Pease.
 May 14, 1945, to Marguerite Jenison Pease and Theodore Calvin Pease.
 July 16, 1945, to Marguerite Jenison Pease and Theodore Calvin Pease.

Marguerite Jenison Pease noted: "Dana Lamb Walker, Los Angeles (a cousin). Ensign, U.S. Navy Reserve. Two years service in Great Britain, 1943-45. Attached to Eisenhower's staff." His marriage is noted in Edward H. Jenison's April 2, 1945 letter.
