Leonard W. Volk

Box 12	Lincoln plaster mask, copy, modeled after 1860 Leonard Volk life mask, created by the Mazzolini Artcraft Company of Cleveland, Ohio, circa early 1900s. Donated by Harlan H. Horner and Henrietta Calhoun Horner, 1952
Box 13	Cast of Lincoln's hands, copy, modeled after 1860 Leonard Volk cast, circa early 1900s. Donated by Governor Henry Horner, 1938
Box 14	Cast of Lincoln's hands, copy, modeled after 1860 Leonard Volk cast, circa early 1900s. Donated by Harlan H. Horner and Henrietta Calhoun Horner, 1952
Box 15	Douglas plaster mask, copy, modeled after 1857 Leonard Volk cast, circa early 1900s. Gift of Robert W. Johannsen, 1968

Case 1

Ox-Yoke reportedly created by Abraham Lincoln, 1830s. [In 1875 the ox-yoke was presented to John M. Gregory, Regent of the Illinois Industrial University (now the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign) by C.M. Smith via Watson Pickrell Esq. There are conflicting stories regarding how Smith — Lincoln's brother-in-law — came to be in possession of the ox yoke.]

Item 1

Bissell, George E. Bronze bust of Lincoln with plaque, 1930s. The plaque reads:
"Presented to Harlan H. Horner by his associates and the professional board of the [New York] Education Department, 1939." [Arrived with original Horner donation in 1952.]

Box 19

Cane with bust of Lincoln carved in relief near the top, made from an oak doorpost in Lincoln's home at New Salem, Illinois, undated. Presented to [the University?] by Nellie Lewis-Read Ross, University of Illinois Class of 1901

Cane, made from a piece of black walnut from the main balustrade in the Old State House in Springfield, Illinois, undated. Presented to the University of Illinois in 1920 by Colonel Warren R. Roberts, Class of 1920

"Flower from Lincoln's Casket," circa 1865. Transferred from University Archives October 21, 2009.

Cheever, D.A. "Cheever 34-Star American Flag," circa 1860s. [34-star flag dated between 1861 and 1863. It is said to have been carried during Abraham Lincoln's funeral procession. "D.A. Cheever" is handwritten in blue ink on the flag's border.] Also cataloged as 929.920973 C415. (174 cm x 262 cm)

Alschuler, Samuel. Photograph of Abraham Lincoln, carte de visite of ambrotype. Framed by Joseph O. Cunningham, Urbana, Illinois, circa 1900. Includes a note from J.O. Cunningham describing the events preceding Alschuler taking the photograph. Previously cataloged as 973.7L63 E3P56.
More information: Alschuler sold the ambrotype, which he took in Urbana, Illinois, on April 25, 1858, to William H. Somers. Somers then copyrighted the image in 1885.
