4. Charles M. Aten, New Lisbon, Ohio, to H. Wierman, April 29, 1842 (attorney's letter
regarding litigation)
5. William C. Wierman, Putnam County, Illinois, to [Isaac W. Pearson], March 18, 1845
6. Charlotte Pearson, Putnam County, Illinois, to [Isaac W. Pearson], October 26 and 30,
1845 (newcomer's reaction to Illinois landscape and politics)
7. Susan [Wierman], Magnolia, Illinois, to [Isaac W. Pearson], August 6 and 7, 1848
(partisan Liberty Party letter, attacks Zachary Taylor and his supporters)
8. Charlotte Pearson, Magnolia, Illinois, to [Isaac W. Pearson], September 11, 1856
(discusses changes in Illinois since 1845)
