John Mason Peck

Marguerite Jenison Pease collected these materials, mostly photocopies and transcripts, as source material for a 1934 Dictionary of American Biography entry (credited to her husband) on John Mason Peck, an influential Illinois pioneer and a Baptist preacher, author, educator, and newspaper editor.

- 48. New England Baptist Library Collection. Letters and Papers, 1827-1856 (26 items; transcripts). Correspondents include the secretary of the Northern Baptist Education Society of Boston, the Massachusetts Missionary Society, David Benedict, S. S. Cutting, and George Haskell.
