James, Edmund Janes, Papers, 1876-1924

12.8 cubic feet

Named after a famous clergyman, Edmund J. James (1855-1925) was born in Jacksonville, Illinois. His father, Colin Dew James, was a minister (and a farmer) who followed a circuit for the Illinois Methodist Conference and his family moved more than twenty times between 1834 and 1864. The family of thirteen children finally settled in 1863 in Bloomington, Illinois, the site of Illinois Normal University, which trained teachers, but which also maintained model grammar and high schools. A restlessness of wandering spirit also characterized James in his pursuit of higher education. After attending Northwestern University for a year, he transferred to Harvard, where again he remained only one year, apparently disappointed at finding the faculty less stimulating than those he had found at Normal's model high school. Traveling to the University of Halle in Germany, James earned his doctorate in 1877 in political economy after only two years. When he had completed his studies, he first served as principal in Northwestern High School (1878-79) and in the Normal Model School (1879-82).

James came to the attention of educators and politicians during the term of his leadership at the Wharton School of Economics in the University of Pennsylvania (1883-95). Like many other political economists of his time, James was a representative of the new or progressive economic view that claimed that the greatest good came not from individual initiative but from the larger social community, whether local, state or national. James became well known for his support of municipal control of utilities and of transportation. He directed extension work at the University of Chicago (1896-1901) and was president of Northwestern University (1902-04). His name was on lists for the United States presidency and senate. He was able to find support for many of his ideas and to put them into practice after he became president of the University of Illinois (1904-20), which transformed Illinois into a modern university.

Many of the earlier materials in the papers relate to Germany, a travel journal, class lecture notes and songbooks (1878, 1886) from his school years; some of the materials may have originated with his wife, Anna Margaret Lange, a German whom he met while at Halle. A manuscript James wrote on University reform in Germany also forms part of the Papers. A Civil War songbook (1883), family accounts book for 1886-1907 and notebooks of his brothers and sisters make up some of the early material (1893-94, 1903). A great proportion of James' personal correspondence was with his family members (1904-20). Notes and sermons by Rev. Elias J. Sarkis, who studied at Andover Theological Seminary are also contained in the papers. In James' diaries (1894-95, 1901-02, 1904-24) can be found notes on his correspondence and interviews with Theodore Roosevelt (1905, 1916).
