Also included is a copy of Hick's Doctoral Thesis, (the second part of which was not published): "A. The Shape of the Compton Line for Helium and Molecular Hydrogen B. Bond Formation in Simple Molecules", 1939. The Publications in box 1 were written while Hicks was at the California Institute of Technology (1935-39), University of Wyoming (1939-40), with the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics during World War II (1940-46), at the Ballistic Research Laboratory of the Aberdeen Proving Ground (1946-53) and Control Systems Laboratory (after 1959: Coordinated Science Laboratory) at the University of Illinois (1953-60). Paper topics include subjects from physical chemistry, aerodynamics and geophysics.

The publications of box 2 were written while Hicks was with the Coordinated Science Laboratory (1961-70) and the College of Education at the University of Illinois (1970-), a visiting professor at the Universities of Alberta and British Columbia (1968-70), and as a member of the Center for Instructional Research and Curriculum Evaluation (1964-66), the Computer-based Education Research Laboratory (1964-69), and the Commission to Examine the Role of the College of Education (1973-74). Subjects include computer applications in education.
