Headman's Resolution, 1979; granting of doctorates at the University, 8/95; football coach, 1/2 & 27/00; "Some Early Inside History and Its Lessons" - 13 pages on agricultural education at Illinois, 1901; responsibilities of the president of the University with respect to department heads and the Council of Administration, 5/28/01; university becoming first in the country, 10/20/09 and a 7 page proposal for "A State Institute of Sanitary Science and Public Health", 1908.
