Biographical chronology

Aug. 6, 1887 - Born in Dobbs Ferry, N.Y.

1910 - Awarded Ph.B. degree from Yale University - Sheffield Scientific School

1910 - Employed by Standard Oil Co. of New York

1913 - Sent by SOCONY to Constantinople to explore for oil. Traveled and lived in the Near East throughout WWI, including in Jerusalem continuously from 1915-17.

1917 - Left SOCONY and accepted appointment as special agent in Cairo for U.S. Department of State

1918 - Appointed captain in the U.S. Army through auspices of Department of State. Later named American Military Observer with General Allenby's forces in Palestine

1919 - Named technical advisor to the American section of the International Commission on Mandates in Turkey (King-Crane Commission)

1920 - Returned to the United States

1928 - Named instructor of history at University of New Hampshire

1942 - Appointed Department of State Specialist for the Palestine Area

1945 - Resumed post at University of New Hampshire

1957 - Accepted position teaching history at Boston University

1967 - Retired from Boston University

Feb. 26, 1975 - Died in Derry, New Hampshire
