The last 2.1 cubic feet from Oct. 1946 to 1957 contain more letters and longer letters, often ten a month. Stidham reported news of her life in Mahomet and discussed mutual friends, art and literature. She opposed hunters, trespassers, and the nearby Lake of the Woods development. (6 folders), Oct. 1946 - Aug. 1947

After 1955, Ms. Stidham's health declined, Her last letter was written on Feb. 21, 1957 and she died on April 9, 1957. The papers contain two letters from Torkom Boyajian (March, July 1957) and letters from brother Joe Stidham about farm life, the loss of his sister and his health problems (8 folders), May, 1957 - Dec. 1960.
