- AC) Help Week Trophy (ordered from ATO Central Office by chapters to give in interfraternity competition for the best community service project on their campus. First mentioned with smaller cut than this in May 1957 Palm, 33)
- AD) Night scene of ATO NHQ, 107 E. Green St., Champaign, soon after 1965 dedication (a larger uncropped version was used on p. 3 of Dec. 1965 <u>Palm</u>)
- P5816) "Smoke-Rings From the Editor's Stogie," full-page background cut with dropout lettering used for Harry L. Bird's editorials on inside front cover of Feb. 1959-Sept. 1963 Palm.

EMBOSSING DIES

- D1) "ATO--Alpha Tau Omega." Mounted on wood. Bill Krahling says this might have been the die used for folders in the 1960s.
- D2) Centennial medallion. Brass. Used on cover of the program for Centennial Day Celebration in Champaign, IL, Aug. 28, 1965.
- D3) "100" used on letterhead for the Committee of 100 involved with staging the Centennial celebration in 1965. Steel.
- D4) Intertwined Greek letters "ATO", 2 1/6" x 1 1/2". Steel. Used on letterhead and business cards, probably in the 1960s. (Accompanying wrapper dated 11-19-68)
- D5) Intertwined Greek letters "ATO", 3 1/8" x 1 5/8". Smaller and slightly different in design from D4. Zinc or steel. Used for business cards, probably late 1960s and early 1970s.
- D6) Front cover design of hardcover ritual, "Ritual and Secret Work--Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity-***" 1947. Copper-plated steel.
- D7) Front cover design of hardcover membership manual, "The Manual of Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity--Reno", 1939. Brass.
- D8) Spine lettering of "Manual of Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity--Reno," 1929 and 1939 editions. Brass.
